On a side note:

This week the U.S. Supreme Court agreed with the State Department that Jerusalem is not in Israel! This is a final straw of judgment for America and I'll tell you why.

The child in the case was born in West Jerusalem, which has always been considered in Israel unlike East Jerusalem. This ruling reveals, clearly and forever, that it is US foreign policy that no part of Jerusalem is part of Israel. AS far as US policy is concerned, Jerusalem isn't in Israel.

This is why, the day after the ruling, a State Department spokesperson refused to name even West Jerusalem as the capital of Israel. So now 'no Jerusalem for the Jewish people' is official US foreign policy.

Get a load of this!

There are three Jews on the Supreme Court that voted against saying Jerusalem was a part of Israel because they were afraid of the " political Giants" around the world.

Well this weekend's torah portion, read all over the world in every synagogue "just so happens" to be "Shelach" the very story about the spies that brought the bad report, making a horrible judgment call, because they feared the giants in the land. God told them Israel was theirs for the taking and a horrible disaster came resulting in having to wander for 40 yrs in the desert.

The Jewish sages have always said history is lived out in some way in each the torah portions!

I agree with Chief Justice Roberts dissenting opinion when he's stated that " Never before has this Court accepted a President's direct defiance of an Act of Congress in the field of foreign affairs.."

Also Justice Scalia hit the nail on the head when he said in his dissenting opinion, "It is certain that, in the long run, it will erode the structure of separated powers that the People established for the protection of their liberty."

Here is my next point:

Congress passed the act declaring that Jerusalem was a part of Israel for passport issuance was in 2002 the first year of the new seven-year cycle after the Shemittah in 2001. Now we are in the closing 7th year of that shemittah cycle and we are about to begin the first year of a new cycle this September. This could be the United States entering a judgment cycle like never before. Especially since July 4th our celebrating our independence this year and gaining freedom from our oppressors is also the 17th of Tammuz the same day Israel worshipped the golden calf. And it just so happens in 1776 the 4th of July also fell on the 17th of Tammuz. I believe judgment will fall on this nation this coming fall through 2016 as a result of operating out of fear and rejecting that any of Jerusalem is in the nation of Israel!

Recipes

Firecracker Grilled Alaska Salmon

PREP 20 mins
COOK 20 mins
READY IN 6 hrs 40 mins



Ingredients:

Original recipe makes 8 servings

- 8 (4 ounce) fillets salmon
- 1/2 cup peanut oil
- 4 tablespoons soy sauce
- 4 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 4 tablespoons green onions, chopped
- 3 teaspoons brown sugar
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground ginger
- 2 teaspoons crushed red pepper flakes
- 1 teaspoon sesame oil
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Directions:

1. Place salmon filets in a medium, nonporous glass dish. In a separate medium bowl, combine the peanut oil, soy sauce, vinegar, green onions, brown sugar, garlic, ginger, red pepper flakes, sesame oil and salt. Whisk together well, and pour over the fish. Cover and marinate the fish in the refrigerator for 4 to 6 hours.
2. Prepare an outdoor grill with coals about 5 inches from the grate, and lightly oil the grate.
3. Grill the fillets 5 inches from coals for 10 minutes per inch of thickness, measured at the thickest part, or until fish just flakes with a fork. Turn over halfway through cooking.

Brazilian White Rice

PREP 15 mins
COOK 30 mins
READY IN 45 mins



Ingredients:

Original recipe makes 8 servings

- 2 cups long-grain white rice
- 2 tablespoons minced onion
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 cups hot water

Directions:

1. Place the rice in a colander and rinse thoroughly with cold water; set aside.
2. Heat the oil in a saucepan over medium heat. Cook the onion in the oil for one minute. Stir in the garlic and cook until the garlic is golden brown. Add the rice and salt and cook and stir until the rice begins to brown. Pour hot water over rice mixture and stir. Reduce heat to low, cover the saucepan, and allow to simmer until the water has been absorbed, 20 to 25 minutes.

Grilled Asparagus

PREP 15 mins
COOK 3 mins
READY IN 18 mins



Ingredients:

Original recipe makes 4 servings

- 1 pound fresh asparagus spears, trimmed
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- salt and pepper to taste

Directions:

1. Preheat grill for high heat.
2. Lightly coat the asparagus spears with olive oil. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
3. Grill over high heat for 2 to 3 minutes, or to desired tenderness.

Sweet and Silky Strawberry Sorbet

PREP 15 mins

COOK 5 mins

READY IN 2 hrs 30 mins



Ingredients:

Original recipe makes 4 servings

- 1 pound ripe strawberries, hulled and chopped
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1 pinch salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cold water
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice

Directions:

1. Place berries in the work bowl of a food processor and puree until smooth. Combine berry puree, sugar, and salt in a large saucepan. Heat until melted and just simmering. Whisk cornstarch into the cold water; stir into heated berry mixture. Remove from heat, and stir in lemon juice. Cool slightly. Refrigerate berry mixture until cold, about 2 hours.
2. Freeze in ice cream maker according to manufacturer's instructions.

This Day in Jewish History

Sivan-Tammuz

[14 Sivan]

-First attack on the Jewish community of Frankfort on the Main. The Jewish Quarter was destroyed and most of the Jews were massacred, 1241.

-Germany's emperor rescinded an order to burn all Hebrew books found in Cologne and Frankfort, 1510.

-Auto-da-fe claimed the lives of 24 Jews in Barcelona, 1588.

-Yahrzeit of Rabbi Chaim of Volozhin, 1821.

[15 Sivan]

- Traditional date for the birth of Yehuda.
- The Crusaders laid siege to Yerushalayim, 1099.
- King of Poland denied the Jews of Vilna the right to deal in non-Jewish books, 1664.
- Israeli forces crossed into Lebanon to destroy PLO bases, 1982.

[16 Sivan]

- The beginning of a substantial Jewish settlement in Massachusetts, 1716.
- French (Vichy) planes bombed Tel Aviv, 1941.

[17 Sivan]

- No'ach's Ark rested on Mt. Ararat.
- Chashmona'im captured and settled Migdal Tzur. The date was observed as a holiday.

[18 Sivan]

- The city of Acco was captured by Muslims, 1291, bringing to an end the Christian domination of Eretz Yisrael.
- The Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America (parent organization of the Israel Center) was founded, 1898.
- The Nazis in control of France ordered Jews to wear a yellow star with the word "Juif" on it, 1942.
- Spain passed a law granting Jews and Protestants the right of public worship, including permission to mark their places of worship and advertise their religious services. This was the first such law since Ferdinand and Isabella proclaimed Catholicism as Spain's only religion. This law was passed in 1967.

[19 Sivan]

- The first Jewish hospital in America - Jews' Hospital of New York - admitted its first patient, 1855. (The Jews of Berlin had a small hospital in the 16th century. Jews of Rome had their own hospital in the 17th century. Russian Jews had 112 hospitals prior to World War I. On the other hand, when the Jews of Bucharest petitioned the government for permission to build a hospital - this, following the death of a Jew who was denied admission into the city hospital - the petition was denied.)
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Shmuel Mohilever, 1898. One of the founders and leaders of Religious Zionism in Russia, and the Mizrachi movement, he was also instrumental in the establishment of Ekron and Rehovot.

[20 Sivan]

- 34 Jewish men and 17 Jewish women were burned at the stake in Blois France, 1171, as a result of the first ritual-murder trial in Europe. Rabbeinu Tam declared a fast day to mark the event. The day was confirmed as a fast day centuries later, in Poland, following the murder of 6000 Jews of Niemirow during the Chmielnicki massacres, 1648. Many Siddurim have Slichot for Kaf Sivan.
- Although Yom Yerushalayim is 28 Iyar, 20 Sivan marks the day that Israel annexed the Old City and officially united all of Jerusalem, 1967.

[21 Sivan]

- Mentioned by some sources as the day Miriam was afflicted with Tzoraat (others say the 22nd or the 23rd), as we read about in this week's sedra. (It is noteworthy when an event mentioned in the Torah is read approx. at the same time that it occurred.)
- Muslim conqueror of Constantinople granted equal rights to Jews and other non-Muslims, 1453. This provided a haven for many Jews who fled Spain 39 years later.
- Harvard created a professorship of Hebrew and Oriental languages, 1765.

[22 Sivan]

- The Pope ordered the Jews of Carpentras, France to wear distinctive yellow hats, 1525.

[23 Sivan]

- King Yeravam stopped the Jews of the northern kingdom from bringing Bikurim to Yerushalayim.

- Mordechai issued a royal decree calling upon the Jews of the kingdom to defend themselves against attack. (This is the oldest record of an organized Jewish self-defense in the Diaspora.)
- Fast day of the Jewish community of Pesaro, Italy, to mark the murder of Jews following retreat of Napoleon's army, 1798.

[24 Sivan]

- Yahrzeit of R. Moshe b. Shlomo HaKohen, a German Tosefist, 1198.

[25 Sivan]

- Geviha b. Pesisa, Jewish delegate, won the debate against the Samaritans in the presence of Alexander the Great.
- Rabban Shimon b. Gamliel, Rabbi Yishma'el b. Elisha, Rabbi Chanina Segan HaKohanim were martyred by the Romans (they were among the Asara Harugei Malchut).
- Massacre of the Jews of Erfurt, Germany, 1221.

[26 Sivan]

- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Yitzchak b. Chaim, head of the Volozhin Yeshiva, 1849.

[27 Sivan]

- End of Miriam's confinement in the Midbar.
- The Romans stormed the Samaritan stronghold on Har Gerizim and killed 11,600 people, 67ce.
- Rabbi Chanina b. T'radyon, one of Asara Harugei Malchut, was burned at the stake. Rabbi Akiva was imprisoned. 132ce.
- Second expulsion of Jews from France, 1322.
- Purim of Florence, celebrating escape from massacre, 1790.
- Memorial day for Lithuanian Jewry.

[28 Sivan]

- Bnei Yisra'el arrived in Midbar Paran.
- Slobodka Yeshiva closed its doors, 1941.

[29 Sivan]

- Moshe sent the Meraglim to survey Eretz Yisrael.
- Follow the contrast: Chovevei Tzion was founded in America, 1897. Six years later, same date, Russia banned all Zionist meetings, 1903.
- Germany occupied Kovno and Vilna, 1941.

[30 Sivan]

- Residence tax on Hungarian Jews was abolished, 1846.
- Numerous Jews were killed in a pogrom at Jassy, Rumania, 1941.

[1 Tammuz]

- Yaakov and family went down to Mitzrayim (according to one source. This would be the establishment of the first voluntary Jewish settlement outside of Eretz Yisrael).
- Many Jews were killed by a riotous mob in Seville, 1391. The riots spread throughout Spain.
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Shlomo Kluger, 1869.
- Massacre of 2300 Lithuanian Jews by Lithuanians, 1941.

[2 Tammuz]

- Rabbi Shmuel b. Yechiel of Cologne was killed by Crusaders, 1096. Earthquake hits Eretz yisrael, 1927.

[3 Tammuz]

- Yehoshua "commanded" the Sun and the Moon to stand still.
- Rabbi Menashe b. Yisrael petitioned for permission to practice Judaism in England. Permission was granted by the Council of State, 1656.
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Bernard Illowy, 1871. A staunch opponent of the Reform movement, he was the first

Orthodox rabbi with a PhD from Europe to settle in the U.S.

-1500 Jews of Kovno and 11,000 Jews in Kishinev were killed, 1941.

-Emperor Alexander II of Russia gave the Jews permission to print Jewish books, 1871.

-The Yahrzeit of the Lubavitcher Rebbe.

[4 Tammuz]

-Yahrzeit of Rabbeinu Tam, 1171.

-Rabbi Meir of Rothenberg was imprisoned, 1286.

-40 Jews killed on charges of ritual murder, 1286.

-1000 Jews in Poland tortured and killed by Cossacks, 1648.

-Jerusalem bombed for the first time in its history, 1948.

[5 Tammuz]

-Yechezkeil's first prophecy, 502b.c.e.

-Memorial fast day for approx. 50,000 Ukrainian Jews killed in 1768.

[6 Tammuz]

-Crusaders massacred Jews of Mehr, 1096.

-24 wagonloads of Sifrei Kodesh burned in Paris, 1242.

-Hebrew date of the raid at Entebbe.

[7 Tammuz]

-Ukrainian rioter kill many Jews, 1919.

-Hundreds of Jews of Yurburg, Lithuania executed by the Nazis, 1941.

[8 Tammuz]

-Jews expelled from Genoa, 1567.

-Queen-Mother of Spain abolished the Inquisition, 1834.

-Pogrom in Bialystok, 1903.

[9 Tammuz]

-Nevuchadnezer's army breached the walls of Jerusalem, 586bce.

-Pompey captured Jerusalem and killed 12,000 Jews, 63bce.

-Anti-Jewish riots in Austria, 1230.

[10 Tammuz]

-Tzidkiyahu HaMelech was captured by the Babylonians, 586bce.

-12 Jews of Cologne were martyred, 1266.

-Fast observed by the Jewish community of Frankfort on the Maine to mark the escape of the Jewish quarter from a major fire, 1720.

[11 Tammuz]

-Purim of Tammuz for Jews of Algiers to mark their escape from attack by the Spanish army, 1774.

[12 Tammuz]

-Massacre of the Jews of Weiner-Neustadt, Austria, 1298.

-Jews denounced to the Inquisition received the right to face their accusers, 1298. This had not always been so. It is an issue in many episodes of Jewish and World history, ranging from the Roman Coliseum through European dictatorships to the McCarthy senate hearings.

-Yahrzeit of the Baal HaTurim, 1340.

-Nazis executed 5000 Jews in the fortress of Kovno, 1941.

-Yahrzeit of Rabbi Elchanan Wasserman, HY"D, 1941.

[13 Tammuz]

-First printed edition of Sefer HaChinuch, 1523. It still makes the great Bar Mitzva gift 477 years later.

-The Jew badge was decreed for all Jews in the Baltic States, 1941.

-Minsk (Russia) was captured by the Germans, 1942 trapping about 40,000 Jews in the city.
