This will be followed the following Shabbat with our "Shema around the World!" We are asking congregations to state they will read the greatest commandment from Deuteronomy 6 the same weekend all the Jews around the world are reading the same weekend.

Deuteronomy 6:4-6 Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord: And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes. And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates.

That weekend is the weekend after the dire straits and begins the time for the nations to comfort Israel and Jerusalem as Isaiah 40 is also read around the world.

Is 40:1,2 Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God.
Speak ye comfortably to Jerusalem, and cry unto her,

We will have Josh Reinstein all the way from Israel! Josh Reinstein has been the Director of the Knesset Christian Allies Caucus since its inception on January 5th 2004. Josh Reinstein is the producer and founder of the hit TV show, Israel Now News. Israel Now News is a half an hour weekly news magazine that is broadcast to 35 million viewers in a 191 countries around the world.

Mr. Reinstein grew up in Dallas, Texas and Toronto, Canada. He is an honors graduate of the University of Western Ontario, where he earned a degree in Political Science. He served as a tank gunner in the elite 188 unit of the Israel Defense Forces Armored Corps. He currently lives in Jerusalem with his wife, Rebekah and three sons. In 2012, Mr. Reinstein was named as one of the "50 most influential Jews in the world" by the Jerusalem Post.

We will also have Eric Stakelbeck! Erick Stakelbeck is a sought after authority on Middle East and national security-related issues with extensive experience in television, radio, print and digital media. A 2013 Jerusalem Post profile stated that, "Within Evangelical Christian circles, Stakelbeck is considered by many to be the leading authority" on the issues of terrorism, radical Islam and the Middle East. Since 2005, Stakelbeck has been a correspondent, host and analyst for CBN News, where his reports and commentary are seen by over 1 million daily viewers in the United States alone. He covers U.S. national security, the Middle East, Israel-related issues and the growth of radical Islam at home and abroad for the network's Washington, D.C., bureau. Stakelbeck has interviewed numerous lawmakers and world leaders as well as Islamic terrorists.

He's host of the weekly CBN program, The Watchman with Erick Stakelbeck, which is seen on Direct TV and the Dish Network as well as regional markets throughout the United States and in Great Britain, Spain, and Hungary.

Stakelbeck's first book, The Terrorist Next Door: How the Government is Deceiving You About the Islamist Threat was released in 2011 by Regnery Publishing to major acclaim.

His second bestselling book was released by Regnery in July 2013 and is titled The Brotherhood: America's Next Great Enemy. It warns about the rise of the Muslim Brotherhood and the global Islamist movement.

Stakelbeck is a regular contributor to Glenn Beck's The Blaze TV, guest hosting the Glenn Beck Program and providing in-studio analysis and investigative reports.

We also will have Rebecca Brimmer! Rebecca J. Brimmer is the International President and CEO of Bridges for Peace, a Jerusalem based, Bible-believing Christian organization supporting Israel and building relationships between Christians and Jews worldwide through education and practical deeds expressing God's love and mercy. Bridges for Peace has offices in the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, South Africa, Japan, Australia, and New Zealand, with the International Headquarters in Israel. BFP has 12 projects designed to bless the Jewish people in Israel and the former Soviet Union with Christian love. The BFP Food Bank, the largest Christian food bank in Israel, provides food to 27,000 people each month. Rebecca is the Editor in Chief of Bridges for Peace publications including:

Delicious Grilled Hamburgers

PREP 5 mins

COOK 10 mins

READY IN 15 mins

Ingredients:

Original recipe makes 3 servings

- 1 pound lean ground beef
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tablespoon liquid smoke flavoring



- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- seasoned salt to taste

Directions:

1. Preheat a grill for high heat.
2. In a medium bowl, lightly mix together the ground beef, Worcestershire sauce, liquid smoke and garlic powder. Form into 3 patties, handling the meat minimally. Brush both sides of each patty with some oil, and season with seasoned salt.
3. Place the patties on the grill grate, and cook for about 5 minutes per side, until well done.

READY IN 45 mins



Ingredients:

Original recipe makes 6 servings

- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/8 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 pinch onion powder
- cayenne pepper to taste
- garlic powder to taste
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 6 ears corn, husked and cleaned

Directions:

1. Preheat grill for medium-high heat.
2. In a medium bowl, mix together the chili powder, oregano, onion powder, cayenne pepper, garlic powder, salt, and pepper. Blend in the softened butter. Apply this mixture to each ear of corn, and place each ear onto a piece of aluminum foil big enough to wrap the corn. Wrap like a burrito, and twist the ends to close.
3. Place wrapped corn on the preheated grill, and cook 20 to 30 minutes, until tender when poked with a fork. Turn corn occasionally during cooking.

The Best Potato Salad

PREP 20 mins

COOK 20 mins

READY IN 3 hrs 40 mins

Ingredients:

Original recipe makes 12 servings

- 6 eggs
- 10 red potatoes
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup ranch dressing
- 1/3 cup dill pickle relish
- 2 tablespoons prepared yellow mustard
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon paprika
- 1/8 teaspoon celery seed
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup pepperoncini (optional)
- 1/4 cup sliced black olives (optional)



Directions:

1. Place the eggs into a saucepan in a single layer and fill with water to cover the eggs by 1 inch. Cover the saucepan and bring the water to a boil over high heat. Remove from the heat and let the eggs stand in the hot water for 15 minutes. Pour out the hot water; cool the eggs under cold running water in the sink. Peel and chop the cooled eggs.
2. Place the potatoes into a large pot and cover with water. Bring to a boil over high heat, then reduce heat to medium-low, cover, and simmer until tender, 15 to 20 minutes. Drain and refrigerate until cold. Peel and cube once cold.
3. Stir together the mayonnaise, ranch dressing, relish, mustard, salt, pepper, paprika, and celery seed in a mixing bowl. Add the eggs, potatoes, onion, pepperoncini, and olives; stir until evenly mixed. Cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours before serving.

Original recipe makes 2 quarts

- 1 pinch baking soda
- 2 cups boiling water
- 6 tea bags
- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 6 cups cool water

Directions:

1. Sprinkle a pinch of baking soda into a 64-ounce, heat-proof, glass pitcher. Pour in boiling water, and add tea bags. Cover, and allow to steep for 15 minutes.
2. Remove tea bags, and discard; stir in sugar until dissolved. Pour in cool water, then refrigerate until cold.

All American Apple Pie

PREP 25 mins

COOK 45 mins

READY IN 1 hr 10 mins

Ingredients:

Original recipe makes 1 - 9 inch pie

- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons cold milk
- 1 1/2 teaspoons white sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 6 Fuji apples, cored and sliced
- 3/4 cup white sugar



- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup butter

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
2. To Make Crust: In a large bowl, mix together 1 1/2 cups flour, oil, milk, 1 1/2 teaspoons sugar and salt until evenly blended. Pat mixture into a 9 inch pie pan, spreading the dough evenly over the bottom and up sides. Crimp edges of the dough around the perimeter.
3. To Make Filling: Mix together 3/4 cup sugar, 3 tablespoons flour, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Sprinkle over apples and toss to coat. Spread evenly in unbaked pie shell.
4. To Make Topping: Using a pastry cutter, mix together 1/2 cup flour, 1/2 cup sugar and butter until evenly distributed and crumbly in texture. Sprinkle over apples.
5. Put pie in the oven on a cookie sheet to catch the juices that may spill over. Bake 45 minutes.

This Day in Jewish History

Tammuz - Av

[14 Tammuz]

- 250 Jews were killed in Rothenburg, Germany, 1298.
- 30 Jews of Schaffhausen (Switzerland) were burned at the stake on ritual murder charges, 1401.

[15 Tammuz]

- Chur, son of Miriam was killed attempting to dissuade the people from demanding the golden calf. As such he is the first Jew to die "Al Kiddush HaShem", in defense of his faith.
- Druse Arabs attacked the Jews of Tzfat, 1838.

[16 Tammuz]

- The golden calf emerged from the fire into which gold of Bnei Yisrael was thrown.
- Pope confiscated all manuscripts of the Talmud, 1239.

[17 Tammuz]

- Fast day and beginning of the Three Weeks.
- The first Luchot were broken.
- King Menashe placed an idol in the Beit HaMikdash.
- The Korban Tamid was discontinued in the second Beit HaMikdash.
- 4000 Jews were killed in Toledo, Spain, 1391. The riots spread to many other Spanish Jewish communities bringing death and poverty in its wake.
- The destruction of Spanish Jewry began on the 17th of Tammuz and was completed 101 years later on Tish'a b'Av.
- The American colonies declared their independence, 1776.
- 4000 Jews of the ghetto in Bialystok were shot, 1941.

[18 Tammuz]

- Moshe Rabeinu destroyed the Golden Calf
- Louis IX decreed that all Jews must wear the distinctive yellow badge, known as the badge of shame.
- Massacre of the Jewish community of Morgentheim, Austria, 1298.
- Purim of Candia (Crete), from 1583.

[19 Tammuz]

- Moshe ascended Har Sinai a second time.
- The first 14 members of BILU reached Yafo, 1882.
- 6000 Lithuanian Jews were killed in Viszalsyan camp - 1941.
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Yitzchak HaLevi Herzog, first chief rabbi of the State of Israel, 1959.

[20 Tammuz]

- Jews of Telz, including the heads of the yeshiva, were killed by the Nazis, 1941.
- Nazis destroyed the Kovno ghetto, 1944.
- Knesset bill, 1950, granting every Jew the absolute right to settle in Israel.

[21 Tammuz]

- Jews were barred from settling in Brazil, 1567.
- Don Lope de Vera y Alarcon HY"D, Spanish nobleman, convert to Judaism, known as Judah the Believer, was killed by the Inquisition, 1644. The Inquisition "stayed in business" for 182 more years - to the day -executing its last victim in 1826.
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Shlomo Polyatchek, 1928.
- Bendin (Poland) ghetto uprising, 1942.

[22 Tammuz]

- Marranos were permitted to leave Portugal, 1557.

- Yahrzeit of the "Pardes Rimonim", 1570.

[23 Tammuz]

- Crusaders captured Jerusalem, 1099.
- Chmielnicki hordes attack Vilna, 1655, killing many Jews.

[24 Tammuz]

- Crusaders gathered the Jews of Jerusalem into a shul and set it aflame, 1099. All perished in the fire. Jews were barred from the city for the following 88 years.
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Yaakov Joseph (RJJ), 1902.

[25 Tammuz]

- Jews of Lithuania received a Charter of Privilege, 1388.
- Anti-Jewish rioters attacked the funeral procession of Rabbi Yaakov Joseph in New York City, 1902.

[26 Tammuz]

- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Shlomo Ganzfried, author of Kitzur Shulchan Aruch (and other works), 1886. It was estimated that over a 250,000 copies of the KSA were extant at the time of the authors death. Imagine how many copies since then has been printed and sold.
- Jews of Upina, Lithuania were executed by the Nazis, 1941.

[27 Tammuz]

- Pope Innocent III promulgated a Church doctrine that the Jews were doomed to perpetual servitude and subjugation because they had killed Jesus, 1205. (The charge of deicide against the Jews was not officially removed from Church doctrine until 1963. There are still many Christians who believe in the guilt of the Jews, and many who act upon that belief.)
- The third expulsion of the Jews of France, 1322.
- A Jew and the Russian naval officer who converted to Judaism, having been influenced and/or taught by that Jew, were both burned at the stake in St. Petersburg, 1738.
- Jews of Holstein, Germany were granted equality, 1893.

[28 Tammuz]

- 41 Jews were burned at the stake in Breslau, 1453. the rest of the
- Jews were expelled.
- Jews of Brussels were ordered expelled, 1716.
- Jews of Hebron were attacked by Arabs, 1835.

- 5000 Jews of Rovno, Polish Ukraine, were killed by the Nazis, 1942.

[29 Tammuz]

- Yahrzeit of Rashi, "best friend" of anyone who learns Torah or Talmud, 1105.
- The entire male Jewish population of Grodz, Lithuania was killed by the Nazis, 1941.

[1 Av]

- Peaks of the tallest mountains emerged above the receding waters of the Flood.
- Egypt was afflicted with Frog(s).
- Yahrzeit of Aharon HaKohen. This is the ONLY yahrzeit mentioned in the Torah. It is not recorded in Parshat Chukat, which tells of Aharon's death, but rather in Mas'ei.
- Yahrzeit of Elazar b. Aharon HaKohen.
- Ezra and his followers arrived in Yerushalayim, 457bce.
- Armed revolt at Treblinka, 1943. One of several similar outbreaks that were encouraged by the changing tide of the war against Germany.
- The Exodus bearing illegal immigrants was seized by the British, 1947. The Exodus 1947 carried 4000 Jews. Its stirring defiance of the British navy and its ultimate forced return to Germany, was one of the most dramatic and heroic episodes of post-war Jewish history.

[2 Av]

- Titus commenced battering the walls of the courtyard of the Beit HaMikdash, 70ce.
- The Inquisition was established in Rome by Pope Clement IV, 1267.
- Pope Gregory X banned blood-ritual charges against the Jews, 1274. This was neither the first nor the last time a pope tried to ban charges of ritual murder against the Jews. None were very successful.
- Last execution of the Inquisition in Peru took place in 1806.
- French police rounded up 30,000 Jews (including 4,500 children) for deportation, 1942. Only 30 adults are known to have survived the round up.

[3 Av]

- 10,000 Jews of Polannoe perished in the Chmielnicki massacres, 1648.
- Beginning of the mass immigration of Russian Jews to the United States after the pogroms of 1881.

[4 Av]

- Nechemia began to build a wall around Yerushalayim, 444bce.
- Rashba proclaimed a ban on the study of metaphysics and philosophy by students under 30, 1305. The Cheirem was both famous and controversial.

- Lublin concentration camp liberated by the Russian army, 1944.

[5 Av]

- Pope Clement VI forbade forcible baptism of Jews, 1345 (another papal order that was not followed seriously).
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Yitzchak Luria of Tzfat, the Ari Z"l, 1572.
- Anti-Jewish riots in Budapest, 1883, following the acquittal of Jews on ritual murder charges.
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Israel Hildesheimer, 1899. He fought side by side with Rabbi S.R. Hirsch in defense of Orthodoxy.
- Yahrzeit of Rabbi Chaim Ozer Grodzinski, 1940.

[6 Av]

- Spinoza was excommunicated by the Jewish community of Amsterdam, 1656.
- The British House of Commons voted in favor of the emancipation of the Jews of England, 1833.
- The House of Lords rejected the proposal until 1845.

[7 Av]

- Nebuchadnetzar occupied the first Beit Hamikdash, 586BCE.
- Jews of Valencia, Spain were massacred, 1391.
- Goering officially ordered the planning and launching of the Nazi policy of mass executions of the Jews, 1941.

[8 Av]

- Jews of Frankfort, Germany were killed in the Black Death massacres, 1349.
- Jewish community of Vienna was expelled, 1670.
- The Jewish Agency for Palestine was founded, 1929.
- Mass deportation of Jews from the Warsaw ghetto was announced, 1942. Over 300,000 Jews were taken to concentration camps in the 53 days of this Nazi action.

[Tish'a b'Av]

- The Meraglim returned to the people after 40 days of scouting out the land. The Generation of the Wilderness was condemned to die out in the course of 40 yrs. of wandering. Approx. 15,000 adult Jewish males died each year on Tish'a b'Av.
- Both the first and the second Beit Hamikdash were destroyed.
- The Romans plowed up the site of the Mikdash to establish a Roman colony there, 71CE.
- The City of Betar, last independent outpost under Bar Kochba, fell to the Romans, 135.
- King Edward I of England ordered the expulsion of all Jews, 1290.
- The period of expulsion of the Jews from Spain began, 1492.

- 3,000 Jews were killed in Konstantynow, in the Chmielnicki massacres, 1648.
- The Jews of Hungary were emancipated, 1849.
- Petach Tikvah was founded, 1878.
- World War I began, 1914.

[10 Av]

- Birth of Yissachar.
- The first Beit HaMikdash was destroyed by fire that started the day before, 586bce.
- Jews of France were arrested and ordered to leave the country, 1306.
- Hundreds of Jews of Catalonia (region of northeast Spain) were murdered, 1358.
- Columbus set sail for the new world, 1492.
- Jews of Rome were forced to move into a ghetto, 1555.

[11 Av]

- Anti-Jewish riots in Arnstadt (Germany), 1264.
- Anti-Jewish riots in Breslau (now Wroclaw, Poland), 1360, many Jews were killed, the rest expelled.
- Edict of expulsion of Bohemian Jews was revoked by Empress Maria Theresa, 1748.
- The Common Council of New York City revoked the license of a non-Jewish butcher for affixing Jewish seals to non-kosher meat, 1796. This is the earliest act of legal intervention in protection of kashrut.
- Arab forces blew up the Latrun pumping station, 1948, cutting of Jerusalem's water supply.

[12 Av]

- The famous disputation between the Ramban and Pablo Christiani began, 1263. King Jayme of Aragon hosted the debate, guaranteed the Ramban freedom to say what he pleased, and rewarded the Ramban with 300 gold coins for his "most admirable defense of a wrong position".
- 38 Jews were burned at the stake in Berlin, 1510.
- The Russian gov't removed the ban on Hebrew and Yiddish periodicals, 1918.
- Russian army liberated the city of Kovno, 1944.

[13 Av]

- Jews of Wurzburg were massacred, 1298.
- Yahrzeit of Sir Moses Montifiore, 1885.

[14 Av]

- Arabs took control of Eretz Yisrael from the Byzantines, 636.
- Pope Nicholas III requires compulsory attendance of Jews at conversion sermons, 1278.

- 407 Jews of Zhitomir (western Ukraine) were killed by the Nazis, 1941. 10,000 Jews of Minsk were killed by the Nazis, 1942.

[15 Av]
T"U B'AV

- The power of the Almohads, a fanatic anti-Jewish Muslim sect in Spain, was broken in battle, 1212.
- Jews of Great Poland were authorized to elect a Chief Rabbi, 1541.
- Jews of Cochin, India received a large shipment of Judaica, including Sifrei Torah from Amsterdam, 1686. The day was celebrated as an annual holiday.
- Baron Lionel de Rothschild became the first Jew in the British Parliament, 1858, after a new version of the oath of office was agreed upon, without reference to Christianity.
- Tiferet Bachurim, a secret religious youth center was opened in the Kovno ghetto, 1942.
